Melissa's Story: We are better together...

- 10+ years unhoused, addiction, and severe trauma
- Over 30 overdoses, no stable support system
- Entered South Market St. Micro Shelter – April 2024
- Found safety & stability through Housing First model

- Achieved sobriety, despite serious cancer diagnosis
- Reconnected with her children
- Housed through No Place Like Home grant
- Worked with over six different community agencies

Housing Barriers In Our Community

Voucher Waitlist Issues:

- - No visibility on list status
- Missed opportunities due to mailing issues
- Removal from list for not responding to a letter
- Alternate contacts are not contacted on Waitlist
- Clients waiting for years
- No clear contact or prioritization transparency
- Vouchers expiring and clients having to start all over
- Missed housing opportunities hard to synch voucher and apt waitlists
- Transparency around county voucher availability

- Other Housing **Barriers:**
- Landlords seeing case managers as a red flag
- Navigators left out of communication loop
- Lack of rental history
- Bad credit
- Being denied for housing from property manager but not knowing why
- Lack of funds to pay for application fees
- Not enough affordable rentals w/wo voucher
- Housing opportunities that are not sustainable
