III. Simtech Solutions identified key action items that need to be focused on.

- 1) The Volunteer Registration Portal is live at <https://norcal.pointintime.info/>. We still need jurisdictional leads to register for the count. As of today, we only have four people signed up.
- 2) The geographic coverage areas for each county need to be defined. Kevin (CCd) is working on that now. Currently only Shasta has been defined (See below).
- 3) We have recruiting materials to share with the understanding that people may want to tailor these to meet local needs or create their own.
- 4) Regional count admin(s) need to be chosen and given access to the command center. We are in the process of creating a roles and responsibilities for Regional Count Admins document to share.
- 5) Outreach teams and others should be identifying known locations.

5. HIC Planning

These would be programs **that are not included in the 2025 HIC** that meet the attached criteria, “Project Type Reference Sheet”

Seth will attempt to reach out to all providers by December 12, 2025 to allow time to follow-up with those who were only left voicemails or have not yet responded prior to the January 9, 2026 deadline. Once the data is gathered, Pathways will be updating the data in HMIS and it will be used to update the HIC in HDX for the HUD submission

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1. Call to Order/Quorum Established/Introductions - Roll call, Quorum established. Members present: Nicole Lamica, Rebecca Green, Kristen Quade, Emilly Clark. Alternate Sarah Evans represented County of Siskiyou, Alternate Lesha Schaefer represented County of Shasta.

3. Discussion PIT Count Planning & Admin

I. Discuss proposed Schedule of Activities to be presented by Simtech Solutions

The meeting focused on the proposed schedule of activities by Simtech Solutions, with Matt presenting key details about volunteer recruitment and the Counting Us app. He emphasized the importance of internal staff and nonprofit partnerships for recruitment, and outlined plans for a volunteer registration portal with a January 26th count date. Matt also discussed the known location survey tool within the Counting Us app, which will help determine population density across counties, and addressed concerns about custom survey questions, noting that modifications can be made until mid-January.

Matt explained the process for conducting point-in-time homelessness counts, including the use of a volunteer registration portal and mobile app to organize surveyors and monitor the count. He emphasized the importance of using historical data, existing maps, and local knowledge to identify locations and estimate the number of people experiencing homelessness. Matt also discussed the roles and responsibilities of jurisdictional leads and count team leads, highlighting the need for local involvement and data collection to ensure accurate and reliable estimates.

The team discussed volunteer deployment for encampment counts, with Matt explaining that while they collect volunteer demographic data, human decision-making is still needed to match volunteers with appropriate locations based on factors like terrain and experience. Matt demonstrated their Show the Way app, which is used for ongoing data capture of people experiencing homelessness, and mentioned that the next monthly training session would be held on December 6th.

Kristen Schreder discussed plans to organize a demonstration of the Show the Way app for community members and shared Matt's insights on using data tools for targeted outreach and understanding the homeless population better. Matt emphasized the importance of integrating different tools and exercises to improve data accuracy. They also discussed the need for jurisdictional leads and PIT count leads, with Kristen highlighting the importance of having multiple people in these roles to distribute responsibilities and avoid overburdening individuals.

Lesha and Kristen discussed the oversight of app work, with Matt explaining that a designated person would manage the Continuum of Care data, collaborate with jurisdictional leads, and ensure accurate reporting to HUD. Matt demonstrated the Counting Us app's functionality, including data entry, regional management, and team assignments, and emphasized the importance of regional leads. Kristen noted the need to assign regional leads. Matt provided a link for interested individuals to register and create accounts.

The meeting focused on the need for a PIT (Point-in-Time) count lead to replace Dawn who is retiring. Kristen emphasized the importance of this role and requested volunteers, offering to email out the responsibilities and details to all county COCs. Matt clarified the role's duties, explaining it involves overseeing the count process at a global level and coordinating with regional leads. Rachel inquired about the specific responsibilities of the count lead, and Matt and Kristen provided further clarification. They also discussed the help desk system in place to support the count process, with Matt mentioning the team from Simtech available to assist.

II. Unsheltered and Sheltered Surveys. Committee members consider recommending questions to be reviewed at a future meeting TBD.

The team discussed survey revisions for sheltered and unsheltered populations, with Matt proposing a special meeting on December 4th or an alternative date to review survey questions with his team. The team also discussed the importance of generating accurate data to inform local practices. The group discussed survey question alignment with the Counting Us app, with Matt emphasizing the importance of following the established protocol using the default survey instrument and track changes. Kristen Schreder proposed December 4th as a meeting date for input on survey questions, which was confirmed by several participants. Kristen and Matt agreed to work offline on setting up the December 4th meeting. Lesha raised questions about shelter definitions and question language changes, which Matt suggested would be discussed in the next meeting.

Kristen emphasized the need for county-level data reporting and requested volunteers to participate in the survey revision process.

The team discussed the HIC (Homeless Information Count) process and reviewed a list of project types from Pathways. They clarified that shelter surveys are required for emergency shelter, transitional housing, and safe haven programs, but not for rapid rehousing, permanent supportive housing, or other permanent housing. Seth and Daniel are working on contacting providers to collect HIC information, with an email blast planned for later this week or early next week. The team also discussed the need to identify and include any missing permanent supportive housing programs, as well as safe parking programs and sanctioned encampments. Emilly asked when the missing agencies and projects are needed, it was determined that this information is needed as quickly as possible.






POINT IN TIME COUNT TRENDS



UNSHIELTERED SLEEPING LOCATIONS











| Project Type | Definition |

| Emergency Shelter (ES) (Requires Shelter Survey) | A facility that offers temporary shelter to people experiencing homelessness without requiring leases or occupancy agreements; some supportive services may be available. |
| Transitional Housing (TH) (Requires Shelter Survey) | Temporary housing for program participants with signed leases or occupancy agreements, intended to transition individuals to permanent housing within 24 months, unless a longer period is approved by HUD. |
| Safe Haven (SH) (Requires Shelter Survey) | Specialized, low demand housing for people with severe mental illness who have been unable or unwilling to participate in traditional housing or supportive services. These projects must be open 24 hours a day. |
| Rapid Re-Housing (RRH) | Permanent housing projects that provide short- or medium-term rental assistance and supportive services (up to 24 months). Participants must hold a lease. |
| Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) | These projects provide long-term leasing or rental assistance and voluntary supportive services for households with at least one member who has a disability and meets HUD's definition of chronic homelessness. |
| Other Permanent Housing (OPH) | Long-term housing for people who are experiencing homelessness. This housing does not have disability requirements and may or may not include services. |

The definitions above are based on federal regulations, and on guidance published on hudexchange.info.

- All Project Types above are included in the annual Housing Inventory.
- HUD classifies Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, and Safe Haven facilities as shelters, so they are included in the homeless Point in Time count.

C. Criteria for counting sober living or recovery beds in the HIC

Most sober living or recovery beds are not counted in the HUD Housing Inventory Count (HIC).

Below is the breakdown to apply in CoC/HMIS/HIC work:

When recovery or sober living beds are included in the HIC

They are only counted if they meet the definition of a **homeless-dedicated project** under one of the HIC categories:

1. Transitional Housing (TH)

A recovery/sober living program can be counted as TH **if all of these are true:**

- Beds are **reserved for people who are literally homeless**, and
- The project is **in HMIS or required to be**, and
- The program is **funded or recognized** as part of the homeless response system (CoC, ESG, or comparable commitment), and
- The stay is **time-limited** with services designed to move people to permanent housing.

Examples:

- A county-funded Recovery Housing initiative meeting HUD's TH definitions.
- A CoC-funded TH-RRH Joint Component project that uses TH beds for stabilization.

2. Emergency Shelter (ES) (rare)

If a recovery site is designated and operated as *emergency shelter* for people who are literally homeless, it can be counted. This is **rare** for sober living.

3. Permanent Housing (PH)

Again very rare — only if the recovery residence is a bona fide PSH or other permanent housing project dedicated to formerly homeless residents with documentation, services, leases, etc.

When recovery or sober living beds are not included in the HIC

HUD instructs CoCs **not** to include recovery residences or sober living homes when they operate as any of the following:

1. General recovery beds not reserved for the homeless system

- Accept referrals from anyone (probation, self-referral, courts, etc.)
- Do not require participants to meet HUD's "literally homeless" definition
- **Are not governed by HUD homeless program standards or HMIS participation rules**

2. Oxford House-type models

- Democratic resident-managed housing
- **Typically not targeted exclusively to homeless individuals**
- Not considered homeless-dedicated projects

3. State AB 109, probation, parole, or drug court placements

Unless the project is formally enrolled as TH/ES within the CoC and meets all HUD criteria, these are **excluded**.

4. Recovery "treatment" beds

HIC does not count:

- Detox
- Residential treatment
- Licensed treatment centers
- Medical/clinical programs
- Recovery programs funded as behavioral health beds

These fall under *treatment*, not *housing*.

Practical rule of thumb used by many CoCs

If the beds couldn't be claimed in a CoC Program application as TH/ES/PH homeless-dedicated beds, then they should not appear in the HIC.

If they want to be counted, they must:

- Serve only people who meet HUD homeless eligibility,
- Participate in HMIS (or a comparable DB for DV providers),
- Have a housing component that meets HUD project type definitions.
